- A co-lead of the EU-Horizon 2020 funded <u>Sustainability and Procurement in International</u>, <u>European</u>, <u>and National Systems (SAPIENS)</u>. SAPIENS has been awarded a Horizon 2020; Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions Innovative Training Network (ITN) grant of €3,9 million,
- A co-host of the popular <u>Bestek Public Procurement Podcast</u>, which explores public procurement law issues through informal yet in-depth discussions.

In the past, Marta has provided her insight and expertise to key projects for the European Commission, EU Parliament, Danish Institute for Human Rights. She contributed to the profesionalization of the procurement sector through collaboration, teaching and training at multiple universities, national procurement agencies and various institutions and public authorities, including a series of seminars/training for International Training Centre of the International Labour Organization (Italy) and Procurement Regulation Postgraduate Diploma at King's College, (United Kingdom).
