The PET centre at St Thomas requires 2 new state of the art PET-CT scanners for use in a range of activities varying from the provision of a reliable routine clinical service scanning up to 20-25 FDG patients per day, to complex fully quantitative PET research studies involving dynamic scanning and input function measurement. The scanners will be used to image a very wide range of both new and standard PET tracers and radionuclides for applications in the brain, heart and oncology.

The cyclotron will need to supply the minimum needs of the research and development facility and a GMP facility using <sup>11</sup>C, <sup>18</sup>F, <sup>13</sup>N, <sup>15</sup>O, <sup>64/61</sup>Cu and <sup>68</sup>Ga labelled compounds as well as the potential use of other positron emitting radionuclides. Linkage to the new radiochemistry and existing radiochemistry laboratories will be required in addition to future-proofing links to further areas.
