Bassetlaw District Council and Newark and Sherwood District Council (hereafter referred to as 'the Councils') are located in northern Nottinghamshire. The combined Council districts of the 2 authorities make up the bulk of North Nottinghamshire and cover several towns including Newark, Worksop and Retford as well as numerous villages and rural locations.

Both Councils have a statutory duty, under the Environmental Protection Act 1990, to make adequate arrangements to seize any dog found to be straying in a public place or on private land (with the land owner's permission). Additionally, they also have a duty to accept into their care, a stray dog found by a member of the public.

Each year the Councils receive or collect approximately 800 stray dogs from across their combined areas.

Tenders are being sought for the provision of Dog Warden Services to cover the districts of both authorities.

Bassetlaw District Council will incorporate a minimum 10 calendar days standstill period at the point information on the award of the contract is communicated to tenderers. This period allows unsuccessful tenderers to seek further debriefing from the contracting authority before the contract is entered into. Applicants have 2 working days from the notification of the award decision to request additional debriefing and that information has to be provided a minimum of 3 working days before the expiry of the standstill period. If an appeal regarding the award of the contract has not been successfully resolved the Public Contracts Regulations provide for aggrieved parties who have been harmed or are at risk of harm by breach of the rules to take action in the High Court (England, Wales and Northern Ireland). Any such action must be brought promptly generally within 3 months. Where a contract has not been entered into the Court may order the setting aside of the award decision or order the authority to amend any document and may award damages. If the contract has been entered into the Court may only award damages. The purpose of the standstill period referred to above is to allow parties to apply to the Courts to set aside the award decision before the contract is entered into.
