II.2. Scope of the procurement

II.2.1. Total quantity or scope

The Chemical, Biological, Radiation and Nuclear (CBRN) Delivery Team (DT), known as the Authority, are equipment sponsors for chemical, biological and radiological agent detection, monitoring, identification and sample collection equipment used within UK Government. The Authority has a requirement to provide In-Service Support (ISS) for the majority of equipment comprising its "Light Role Team" (LRT) and "Sampling and Identification of Biological, Chemical and Radiological Agents" (SIBCRA) capabilities.

The LRT comprises two vehicles, Command (personnel) and Cargo (equipment), the contractor is not required to provide mechanical maintenance to the vehicles but will be required to maintain various capability related facilities of the vehicles.

The LRT capability provides dedicated, rapidly deployable vehicles, fitted with reach-out communications and stocked with a mixture of Commercial Off-The-Shelf (COTS), Modified COTS (MOTS) equipment and Government Furnished Supplies (GFS), affording the specialist CBRN personnel with Detection, Identification and Monitoring capabilities.

The SIBCRA capability recovers samples for analysis by specialist agencies within a forensic CBRN environment in order to support national strategic decision-making. SIBCRA is also comprised of a mixture of COTS/MOTS/GFS equipment.

The ISS for the LRT and SIBCRA capabilities will include calibration, servicing, repair and replacement, the provision of spares and consumable items, training, disposal of equipment deemed beyond economic repair (BER), input to safety and environmental case management, configuration and obsolescence management and planning, status and progress reports and upkeep of service publications. There will also be an ad hoc Post Design Services (PDS) element to the support contract, which may include the maintenance and upkeep of a technical data pack including the safety case.

The period of support will be for 3 years with options for a further two 1 year extensions.
