With member organisations globally, IDA represents the estimated one billion people worldwide with disabilities. This is the world's largest and most frequently overlooked marginalised group. In agreement with Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO), then co-chair of the Global Action on Disability (GLAD) network, IDA committed to conduct a review and analysis of donor investments in organizations of persons with disabilities (OPDs) capacity building in at least 2 countries, in order to produce strategic recommendations for more coordinated and impactful investments.
