The Trust's current electronic clinical record system, RiO, was originally procured from, and is now currently hosted and delivered on a managed services basis to the Trust by CSE-Healthcare Systems Limited. The Trust now intends to extend its existing contract because (i) it has invested significant time, management effort and cost in working with the provider to tailor the base solution to meet its specific requirements and (ii) although the original contract already allowed for the roll-out of the solution to community settings, the intervening and centrally-led transforming community services initiative resulted in the Trust taking on responsibility for the delivery of care from a number of community settings at a relatively late stage in the life of the original contract and accordingly the solution has only recently (in the last couple of years) been implemented at certain of those community sites and continues to be roll-out to others. The consequence of this has been that the Trust has not been able, during the remaining term of the original contract term to see an acceptable return on investment from such implementations. With this in mind, the Trust plans to further extend its contract with CSE-Healthcare Systems Limited for 36 months with up to two optional extensions of 12 months each, at the end of which the Trust intends to undertake a new procurement exercise to cover its requirements going forward.. This period allows unsuccessful tenderers to seek further debriefing from the contracting authority before the contract is entered into. Applicants have 2 working days from the notification of the award decision to request additional debriefing and that information has be provided a minimum of 3 working days before the expiry of the standstill period. Such additional information should be requested from your procurement lead on this tender process. If an appeal regarding the award of a contract has not be successfully resolved the Public Contracts Regulation 2006 (SI 2006 No 5) provide for aggrieved parties who have been harmed or are at risk of harm by a breach of the rules to take action in the High Court (England, Wales and Northern Ireland). Any such action must be brought promptly (generally within 3 months). Where a contract has not been entered into the Court may order the setting aside of the award decision or order the authority to amend any document and may award damages. If the contract has been entered into the Court may only award damages.
