II.1.5. Short description of the contract or purchase(s)

Wigan Borough Council (“the Authority”), a waste disposal authority for the purpose of the UK Environmental Protection Act 1990, is seeking to enter into a contract for the delivery of an organic waste treatment and disposal solution and related services that will divert the Authority’s Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) from landfill.

This contract covers the transport and treatment/disposal of the household collected organic waste. In addition to the organic waste treatment solution the Authority may seek to include ancillary works and services including (but not limited to) the management of any facilities provided as part of the solution.

The Authority will adopt a contract structure or financing model that best meets its needs and may adapt the contract documentation as appropriate to the solution.

In the case of a solution involving project finance, the project may be subject to a funding competition after the appointment of preferred bidder. The Authority may provide or procure capital contributions and/or finance and may facilitate funding from other public sector bodies. The Authority is not prescribing any specific waste treatment technologies and all technical solutions put forward will be considered.

The Authority has identified a site (within its ownership) that it may make available although the use of alternatives sites proposed by the bidders will not be precluded.

The Authority reserves the right to enter into the whole or part of this contract, both in terms of the scale and scope of the contract.

II.2. Scope of the procurement

II.2.1. Total quantity or scope

The Authority wishes to enter into a contract for the provision of a waste treatment solution that will divert municipal solid waste (MSW) from landfill. Subject to affordability and value for money, the solution will enable the Authority to reduce the increasing impact of landfill tax and waste disposal costs on revenue budgets, achieve long-lasting environmental benefits (such as carbon efficiency) and reach its landfill diversion and recycling and composting targets throughout the duration of the contract.

In the context of this contract, the Authority is procuring the transport and treatment/disposal and of kerbside collected organics.

The solution may contribute to improved recycling and composting performance by allowing for additional pre or post-processing of the contract waste.

For indicative purposes the estimated financial value range for the project is between a total of 23 000 000 GBP to a total of 82 000 000 GBP (dependent on whether the final solution is a merchant offer or a build and on the term of the Contract). In terms of an affordability marker the projected annual budget in relation to the transport, treatment and disposal of this waste in 2014/15 is 1 400 000 GBP. It is difficult to project potential returns as this will depend on many commercial factors. Bidders should seek independent legal and commercial advice in relation to the potential value of the opportunity of the project.
