Cogeneration plant construction work. The Trust is undertaking a project to replace the existing gas engine CHP with two 500 kWe gas engine units. This will include the supply and installation of the units, heat recovery and all system interconnections. The CHP supplier will also supply operation and maintenance services for 15 years.

II.2.1. Total quantity or scope

The proposed works for the replacement of the existing CHP at QEH, Kings Lynn will comprise of the following:

- the disconnection and removal of the existing 3 small CHP and their associated services, housing, etc., to provide a clear working area for the replacement CHP. This will be based on two 500 kWe nominal rated engines,
- all services and their integration into the hospital heating and electrical distribution systems. and works in individual boiler houses, minimising downtime, using out of hours working, providing additional pipework pockets for controls, additional header valves for future expansion of the heating services, individual control adaptation to the newly installed burner controls to work with the CHP and the decommissioning of the existing sequencing equipment,
- all works associated with the contract, employing specialist sub-contractors where necessary, for mechanical, L.V. electrical, H.V. electrical, builders works, fuel gas, dump cooling, acoustic enclosure, air supply and ventilation, controls, fire and gas alarms, connection to site BMS and to existing Hospital services and security systems,
- the replacement CHP units will be bespoke designed of double deck style, and over-clad to provide acoustic treatment and match the existing hospital building exterior.

A comprehensive maintenance contract for the provision of operating and maintenance for 15 years to include all equipment within the scope of the works contract.

VI.4.2. Review procedure

Precise information on deadline(s) for review procedures: The Trust will incorporate a minimum 10 calendar day standstill period at the point information on the award of the contract is communicated to tenders. This period allows unsuccessful tenders to seek further debriefing from the contracting authority before the contract is entered into. Applicants have two working days from the notification of the award decision to request additional debriefing and that information has to be provided a minimum of 3 working days before the expiry of the standstill period. Such additional information should be obtained from the Head of Purchasing and Supplies The Queen Elizabeth Hospital King's Lynn NHS Foundation Trust, The Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Gayton Road, King's Lynn, Norfolk. If an appeal regarding the award of a contract has not been successfully resolved the Public Contracts Regulations 2006 (SI 2006 No. 5) / provide for aggrieved parties who have been harmed or are at the risk of harm by a breach of the rules to take action in the High Court (England, Wales and Northern Ireland).

Any such action must be brought promptly (generally within 3 months). Where a contract has not been entered into the Court may order the setting aside of the award decision or order the authority to amend any document and may award damages. If the contract has been entered into the Court may only award damages. The purposes of the standstill period referred to above is to allow parties to apply to the Courts to set aside the award decision before the contract is entered into.
