Precise information on deadline(s) for review procedures: The Scottish Ministers intend to apply a 10 calendar day standstill period at the point information on the award of contract is communicated to tenderers. This period is to allow companies who object to the decision of the award of contract to raise their concerns with the contracting authority before the contract is entered into. If an appeal regarding the award of contract has not been successfully resolved, The Public Contracts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 provide for aggrieved parties who have been harmed or are at risk of harm by a breach of the rule to take action in the Sheriff Court or Court of Session. Any such action must be brought within 3 months. Where a contract has not been entered into the Court may order the setting aside of the award decision or order the authority to amend any document and may award damages. If the contract has been entered into, in most circumstances the Court may only award damages.
