## **II.2. Scope of the procurement**

### **II.2.1. Total quantity or scope**

2. Puma HC2 ZA940 requires a P4 Depth maintenance iaw the Authority's Topic 5A1. The specifics and detailed Statement of Work for this aircraft is outlined below:

- a. Undertake a P4 maintenance on ZA940 in accordance with the PRE Master Servicing Recommendations;
- b. Undertake additional work on each aircraft as detailed in the DAP 101C-0802-5A1 Master Maintenance Schedule for this service maintenance;
- c. Undertake the inspections and/or remedial work identified in the concessions included at Enclosures 1 to 3 for ZA940. If, upon inspection, the condition of the aircraft differs to that recorded in the concession then the Authority are to be notified, noting that the decision to proceed with any required rectification work will be made by the Authority post dialogue with the Contractor;
- d. Undertake any SI(T)s on ZA940 that are either issued by the Authority whilst the aircraft is undergoing the Depth maintenance or repeat Routine Technical Instructions that are due during the maintenance;
- e. Undertake post maintenance air testing on ZA940 aircraft DAP 101C-0802-5M;
- f. Complete all relevant documentation for the maintenance activities undertaken and provide a final works report for each aircraft to the Authority upon completion of the Depth maintenance;
- g. Update the aircraft's documentation on GOLDesp. (A GOLDesp laptop with the aircraft's record transferred onto it will be provided to the Contractor by the Authority to allow remote updating);
- h. Update the MOD Form 700 as required, with relevant maintenance data performed under this amendment;
- i. Update F703 and F704 entries in the MOD Form 700 as required;
- j. Undertake or arrange for the aircraft to undergo Plastic Media Strip and a re-paint in conjunction with the P4 maintenance;
- k. Scheduled maintenance of the engines would be undertaken by the Authority; however, the contractor would be responsible for removing the engines.

- d. Fixed Fittings for the SA80 Stowage Mount;
- e. Fixed Fittings for the Cabin Stowage Box;
- f. Ballistic Protection Brackets;
- g. Floor Damage Protection Panels;
- h. Fixed Fittings for the Hoist;
- i. Brightstar Lamp;
- j. Fixed Fittings for the Infra-Red Jammer Mount;
- k. Dual Mode Downward Ident Light (DMDIL);
- l. Compressor Wash Modification.

There may be a requirement for further P4 maintenances to additional aircraft.
