IV.1. Description

IV.1.1. Type of procedure

Award of a contract without prior publication of a call for competition in the Official Journal of the European Union in the cases listed below

- Extreme urgency brought about by events unforeseeable for the contracting authority and in accordance with the strict conditions stated in the directive

Explanation:

The compulsory conditions justifying the use of the exceptional procedure are met as described here below:

(a) events unforeseeable by the contracting authority

(i) the current Covid-19 pandemic could not have been predicted in advance, especially in terms of concrete timelines or global disease spread. Therefore, the deliverables included in this procedure were unforeseeable by the contracting authority.

(b) extreme urgency making compliance with general deadlines impossible.

(i) the Covid-19 pandemic has disproportionately impacted populations who may be vulnerable, marginalised, face barriers to health services, or whose social and economic situation meant

they have been and remain highly exposed to the virus and/or with less access to public health preventative measures due to their living/working circumstances. The current study needs to be set up and start work as soon as possible and while the virus is circulating, in order for the results to have the greatest impact and relevancy for addressing the prevention and control of Covid-19 among migrants and ethnic minorities. Therefore is impossible to comply with the normal procurement timelines.

(c) causal link between the unforeseen event and the extreme urgency

(i) the extreme urgency for this exceptional negotiated procedure (e.g. the need to respond to a pandemic) is directly linked to the need for addressing the those who are most impacted by the pandemic. This negotiated procedure and the outputs it will result in could limit the disproportionality of Covid-19, obtain data for planning vaccination strategies and for monitoring the impact of pharmaceutical and non-pharmaceutical interventions in migrants and ethnic minorities.

(d) only used in order to cover the gap until more stable solutions can be found

(i) there are no further plans to address the topic of migrant health and ethnic minorities. This negotiated procedure is deemed critical at this point in time of the pandemic in order to limit the further impact of Covid-19 on migrant and ethnic minority communities in the EU/EEA.
