Our principle activity is the provision of property contracting services to both Spectrum's Registered Providers and external organisations (mainly Registered Providers or public sector organisations). We cover the spectrum of repairs and maintenance services including emergency response repairs and voids. We have particular expertise in planned maintenance programmes including the installation of new kitchens and bathrooms, electrical rewires and upgrades, heating installations and servicing. The business geography covers a large portion of the South and South West Region including the IOW through 5 business centre's in Blandford, Poole, Frome, Ryde and Exeter.
