II.2.4. Description of the procurement

The contract is for the supply of a 2 year domestic waste collection, street cleansing and public convenience cleaning and maintenance service within West Devon.

The waste service includes an alternating weekly collection of residual and garden waste and a weekly collection of recyclables from all 25 328 households within the Borough. Food, glass, metals, paper, card, textiles, plastic bottles and batteries will be collected by kerbside sort method. The cleansing services include sweeping of all adopted highways and cleaning and maintenance of 12 public conveniences.

The council will supply all fleet and infrastructure required and the contractor will provide the technical knowledge of the current service, round structure and local area topography and demographics to assist the council in procuring this fleet. The net income from sales of collected recyclable will pass to the council and the contractor will assist in maximising income by assisting in a brokering capacity.

Explanation:

Local authorities in England and Wales are under increasing pressure to 'deliver more for less' and use a wider range of innovative models to deliver both transformative infrastructure renewal and high-quality public services.

The Council is no exception and has been working with South Hams District Council in a fully integrated and shared manner to run all its services.

The Council intends, through a local authority controlled company, to provide the transport infrastructure for the future waste and cleansing service. This also has a technical bearing upon the delivery of a number of other frontline services which the Council provide, e.g. trade waste collection, grounds maintenance, building and facilities maintenance. The technical infrastructure supporting these services in the future operating model cannot be separated by individual service. The need for asset infrastructure to be in place to support the future services of the Council extends beyond direct vehicle purchase, to depot infrastructure, and interaction with newly delivered ICT.

Due to the specific nature of the area it is deemed essential that the infrastructure procurement is informed by an operator with knowledge of the current service and Council requirements. It is also fundamental that the operator also has a technical understanding of the Council's transformation programme, as well as thorough understanding of the shared working arrangements and intermediate work required to transition to the future working model. There is a technical need to conduct the infrastructure procurement with the support of the incumbent contractor to secure fleet that are fit for purpose to deliver service stability through the assets life expectancy which is well beyond the period of the agreement.

The incumbent has both a technical understanding of the service and its positioning within Devon. This is extremely important in delivering the service over a period of transition in West Devon but also in terms of assisting the transfer of this major service into a fully integrated local authority controlled company and maintaining technical knowledge within the transferred workforce. The aim of the local authority controlled company is to improve service value in a wider area than that of the managed service. Therefore it is important that the delivery partner shares this understanding and recognises the wider implications of local service changes.
