List and brief description of conditions: 2.1.0) Personal situation and general requirements:

— Applicants have to send 1 paper printed and 1 USB/CD-version of their application file by 12:00 of the date as specified in 'Time-limit for receipt of expressions of interest'. Except if a

new date is announced by a Corrigendum on SIMAP, files received after this date and files without USB/CD-version are automatically excluded.

— Applicant will be excluded if the application file does not contain all requested information in exactly the same order as listed in Section III.2) “Conditions for participation”.

A clear and univocal “cross reference table” linking applicant's standard information with the listing in point III.2) would be the only acceptable alternative.

— Applicant shall clearly mention the company's full name, including RPR number, VAT number, full address, legal form and leader of the consortium (if applicable).

— In case of a consortium at least a ‘letter of consent’ between consortium members shall be presented and all members of the consortium have to provide the required information. If not all information is provided for each of the proposed consortium partners, the applicant file of the consortium is immediately excluded as a whole and will not be transformed in a stand alone qualification file of 1 (or more) of the consortium partner(s).

2.1.1) When applying, the applicants will expressly declare in 1 signed letter:

— Their acceptance without any reservation, of Belgian law, regulations and standards applicable for the Scope of Work;

— Their commitment to comply with Contracting Entity's specifications when responding to the invitation to tender, if selected by Contracting Entity;

— That all possible deliveries will be asbestos-free and free of ceramic fibers class 2;

— That they are established in a EU member state or in an E.F.T.A country.

— Having similar (projects/services/supplies) as specified in the Scope of Work as their main activity (or at least a major part of it);

— That they have staff who are proficient in Dutch or English in order to understand technico-commercial enquiries and/or contract negotiations;

— That they are prepared to sign a confidentiality agreement upon request of Contracting Entity.

2.1.2) When applying, the applicants will expressly declare in 1 signed letter, they:

a) Are not in a situation of bankruptcy, liquidation, ceasing business, composition or preventive composition or a similar situation which exists in their national laws and rules,

b) Have not been convicted through a res judicata sentence for an offence liable to affect their professional morality,

c) Have not committed a serious offence whatsoever, on a professional level, and which the Contracting Entity can establish by any means,

d) Have met their obligations as to the payment of social security contributions and taxes according to legal provisions applicable in the country where they are settled and/or in Belgium.

Important remark: Companies with social/fiscal debts in Belgium at the time of submission of the application and/or at any later moment during this award procedure, must provide Contracting Entity with a certification mentioning the exact amount of the debts.

2.1.3) When applying, following information is to be enclosed (or clearly listed with indication ‘not available’):

— The list of main partners/subcontractors, as well as the parts that would be subcontracted out;

— A copy of their company organisation structure (organisation chart) indicating the names of responsible staff where relevant;

— The total number of staff of their company during the last 3 years, as well as the staff turnover rate;

— The composition of the Board of Directors of their company (indicating all shareholders holding at least 25 % of the capital and those holding more than 50 % of the capital, if any);

— A list of their customers representing each more than 20 % of their turnover, indicating the

percentages for the last three (3) years, if any (Contracting Entity reserves the right to seek references).

III.2.2. Economic and financial ability

List and brief description of conditions: 2.2.1. Financial:

When applying, the applicants shall provide:

- Dun & Bradstreet report or similar (max. 3 months old) of the company;
- The consolidated audited financial statements (income statement and balance sheet) for the 3 previous financial years of the company, or, if the company is rated by Moody's, S&P and /or Fitch, the Moody's, S&P and/or Fitch rating of the company;
- The legal name(s) of the bank(s) that will provide the bank guarantee at 1st request (minimal 15 % of the total contract amount, increased at sole discretion of Contracting Entity if economical situation is requesting for it), as soon as the contract is awarded to applicant.

Applicant will be excluded (or by replacement its ultimate guarantor, if any) when:

- Contract value for the actual Scope of Work/expected contractual planning in years > 1/2 sales value of the past year (consolidated for consortium) and.

2.2.2. Insurances:

Applicant shall declare in 1 signed letter that, if awarded, he will have a valid General Liability Insurance representing a coverage of not less than 500 000 EUR each and every loss, all damage combined. If applicant is not based in Belgium, he will also declare that a Workmen's Compensation Insurance or equivalent is in place. Insurance(s) issued by a well-established European Insurance company will be valid for the whole period from award till end of Scope of Work, or replaced by an equivalent insurance without any time laps between insured periods. Where necessary, Contracting Entity will make inquiries with the applicant for more information. Certificates issued by its insurance company, valid for at least another 6 months are only to be provided during tendering phase.

III.2.3. Technical and professional ability

List and brief description of conditions: 2.3.1) When applying, the applicants will expressly:

- Demonstrate that it has successful experience in Europe as main contractor in the execution of at least five (5) projects/services/supplies of a nature, budget and complexity comparable to the proposed Scope of Work within the last three (3) years; in these references, special attention must be paid to projects/services/supplies related to natural gas (SEVESO and ATEX area's).

In addition, the following specific experience must be provided:

- Place of execution, name of the principal and his contact person;
- Period and deadline of execution;
- Extent and nature of the works (amount of the order, ...);
- Provide evidence of its experience with a quality and security plan for similar works and in existing facilities. In particular, applicants preferably have a ISO 9000 or at least a quality management system satisfying the essential elements of ISO 9001. In this respect, the certificate, the delivery date and the institution granting the certificate, shall be indicated. Applicants without ISO 9000 certificate have to prove that the follow-up and the conducting of subcontractors and suppliers are determined in a quality system compliant with applicable conditions 7.1, 7.2, 7.4, 7.5, 8.2.4 and 8.3 of ISO 9001. For Joint Ventures, the certificate holder must master the project quality system. The quality system must be applicable on site also:
- Prove of experience or knowledge of the of environmental criteria applicable in Belgium and more specific in the concerned regio.

Companies with a ISO 14001:2004 certificate shall be given preference to:

- Declare to respect the local legal frames (ARAB/CODEX — General rules on safety at work, AREI — General rules on electric facilities, VLAREM, ATEX ...);
- Provide (Belgian) VCA certificate (or equivalent). In this respect, the certificate, the delivery date and the institution granting the certificate shall be indicated;
- Confirm that applicant's own personnel have staff assignable to the Scope of Supply, on-site in charge of the project, who is fluent in the language of the region (Dutch) and by exception English.

2.3.2) 1 declaration stipulating they:

- Agree to be submitted to a competence audit and fully cooperate, at a reasonable level;
- Accept the qualitative and quantitative inspection, the site progress and the acceptances of the construction works by an independent third party indicated by the Contracting Entity and without this reducing the contractor's responsibilities.

2.3.3) When applying, following additional information is to be enclosed:

- Communicate the name of the overall technical and legal representative (= representative which can bind the applicant in an agreement) to solve local problems during the carrying out as well as between provisional and final acceptance;
- Declare and commit not to let subcontractors (if any) carry out the whole of the Scope of Supply;
- Provide details regarding the training, the qualification and the follow-up system for technicians and operators;
- Provide details how intervention time after installation can be reduced to maximum 4 hours after telephone call.
- Declare that consumption and emission levels shall be according to the prevailing international specifications and standards.
