Procurement of a Tecan Freedom EVO 200 pipetting robot from Bergman Diagnostica for analysing spit samples. FHI currently has an equivalent robot in operation, but needs to increase the capacity for analysing samples from approx. 3 500 to 20 000 per annum.

As an extraction method has already been established, it is important that the new robot is the

same as what we have, as regards set-up, technique and programmes, as the robots shall be used interchangeably in a routine environment.

The works, supplies or services can be provided only by a particular economic operator for the following reason:

By procuring a Tecan with the same set up, same software and script that we already have, we will not have to train and build up experience in super-users and operators. The method and logistics have already been established and, after the delivery and installation, will can be fully operative in routine operations from May 2016. The procurement of other equipment than that which has already been established, will lead to major restructuring costs. These are internal costs that will be incurred in addition to the actual procurement. By procuring another type of robot than what already exists, it will take time to carry out the necessary training, programming and establishing of methods, experience says a minimum of ½ year after the delivery of the actual robot. It would mean that other suppliers than Bergman Diagnostics cannot guarantee operative routine operations from May 2016, which would be a great challenge. FHI would then have to carry out a greater amount of manual preparation for a transitional period (approx. 1/2 year), which would be problematic for the 'chain of custody' and HSE considerations. A manual extraction will require more personnel resources than automatic extraction. There will be both increased personnel resources for manual extraction and personnel resources for establishing the method with a new robot. These are resources that FHI does not currently have and would lead to further costs for the recruitment and training, which have not been included in the above calculation of restructuring costs.
