VI.3.2. Review procedure

Precise information on deadline(s) for review procedures: The Authority will incorporate a minimum 10 calendar days standstill period at the point of information on the award of the

contract to the tenderers. This period allows unsuccessful tenderers to seek further debriefing from the Contracting Authority before the Contract is entered into.

Applicants have two working days from notification of the award decision to request additional debriefing and that information has to be provided within a minimum of 3 working days before the expiry of the standstill period. Such additional information should be requested from the address in Section I.1.

If an appeal regarding the award of a contract has not been successfully resolved the Public Contracts Regulations 2006 (SI2206 No 5), (for public sector) provides aggrieved parties who have been harmed or are at risk of harm by a breach of the rules to take action in the High Court (England, Wales and Northern Ireland). Any such action must be brought promptly (generally within 3 months).

Where a contract has not been entered into the court may order the setting aside of the award damages. If the contract has been entered into the court may award damages.
