The Picture Archiving and Communication System (PACS) is being replaced due to the current NPfIT/LSP system contracts end date of 30.6.2013.

PACS is a part of the whole clinical record, thus within this project and with respect to other Trust IT systems interoperability and adherence to the principles of Integrating the Healthcare Enterprise (IHE) are paramount. The Trust's therefore requires the potential suppliers to be able to provide systems that will provide a "fully integrated" PACS solution for the imaging service and which also provides full integration to hospital EPR and RIS for electronic requesting and result reporting messages. This will include integration with other existing clinical systems. The Trust is also seeking a vendor neutral archive for storage of all Trust imaging and with the ability to data share with other healthcare organisations without duplication.

The Trust is seeking an agreement with a vendor who will provide a PACS/Image Storage solution and service, offering comprehensive 24 hour/365 day support, for the handling, display, storage, retrieval, archiving and communication of images and textual clinical information.
