II.2. Scope of the procurement**II.2.1. Total quantity or scope**

Expressions of interest are sought from companies wishing to be considered for inclusion in the tendering process for a contract for the provision of Independent Test and Evaluation (ITE) Services in support of the C-17 and Command Support (CS) Fleet Aircraft. The duration will be 5 years, which includes 5 years' ITE support for the C-17 fleet, and one year ITE support for the CS fleet; with a further 4 single option years ITE support for the CS fleet. It is intended that the contract will commence on 01/04/14.

1) Quality assurance standard BS EN ISO 9001:2008 or equivalent shall be held.

Quality will be managed in accordance with the following:

2) Def Stan 05-100 MoD Requirements for Certification of Aircraft for Authorised Flight and Ground Running.

3) AQAP 2120 Edition 3, NATO Quality Assurance Requirements for Production

4) The contractor shall be MAOS Mil part 145 approved and DAOS approved.

A pre-qualification questionnaire (PQQ) may be issued to those applicants who have expressed an interest in participating in this requirement. Responses to the PQQ will be assessed in accordance with the evaluation criteria detailed in the PQQ to determine which of those applicants will be invited to submit a tender. Only those companies that can demonstrate a sufficient level of competence against the Authority's PQQ criteria will be considered (this will be a minimum of 5 companies and a maximum of 6 based on evaluation ranking).

The Contracting Authority considers that this requirement may be suitable for economic operators that are small or medium enterprises (SME's). For avoidance of doubt, the Contracting Authority points out that no weight will be attached to whether or not an economic operator is an SME in selecting economic operators to submit tenders or in assessing economically advantageous tender.

To maintain compliance with ITAR, any supplier providing ITE services to the C-17 fleet must be a signatory to the Boeing Technical Assistance Agreement (TA 2999-11). If the supplier whose tender is deemed the most economically advantageous is not a signatory to Boeing TAA TA2 2999-11, an application will be made to amend the TAA to add the new supplier. If the application is not approved, then the contract may not be offered to that supplier and the Authority may determine the competition as ineffective.

The Authority looks for contractors to provide evidence in the following areas:

1. Proven knowledge and capability to deliver the required scope of work for C-17 Globemaster, BAe146 (both variants) and BAe125 platforms.
2. Employment of or access to Suitably Qualified and Experienced Personnel specialising in Aircraft Structures, Mechanical Systems, Electrical Systems, Avionic Systems, Human Factors and Armament Systems.
3. Detailed understanding of Mil-882A Design Standard; JAR 25/CS 25 and BCARS 4 Design Standards, CTC and STC processes and Def Stan 00-970.

When registering an Expression of Interest, suppliers must confirm that they can provide evidence in the areas listed above, and hold and maintain the Quality Assurance standards listed above. Only those expressions of interest that confirm an ability to demonstrate the above criteria will be considered for Invitation to Tender.
