II.2.1. Total quantity or scope

The contractor will be required to provide as a minimum:

1. An in-depth review and gap analysis of petroleum geochemistry data that is available to the project. These data consist of both published material (e.g. technical papers in scientific journals) and data made available by Government and associated agencies. The review will contain recommendations for new analytical work to be approved by the steering committee.
2. Design and conduct an analytical programme involving the petroleum geochemical appraisal of samples (oils, gases and source rocks) considered to be essential to the further understanding of the study area. This analytical work may be subcontracted by the prime contractor to an approved laboratory. The results of these analyses are to be incorporated into the review of the existing database.
3. A Final Report that characterizes the current understanding of the petroleum geochemistry of the study area, with focus on the key questions stated above.
4. An Atlas of Source Rocks, Oil Characteristics and Oil-Source Rock Correlation containing geochemistry and petroleum geology original or reproduced illustrations to adequately document the compilation and original research done during the project. Tables and comparisons of geochemical parameters between wells, basins and the 2 margins should be made. The Atlas should be available in both hard copy and digital form (web accessible). Data to be in ArcGIS format or transferable to GIS format.
5. A Summary Report to include database, methodology and interpretation of the results in easy understandable terms addressed primarily to a 'petroleum geologists and geophysicists' audience and a summary atlas containing pertinent illustrations and text.
6. At least one visit to Dublin and one visit to St John's during the project to present results to the steering committee and presentations at least 2 conferences (nominated by the steering committee) will be required.

The contractor may also, at their discretion, add to the scope of their submission any work item or analytic techniques that they feel could contribute to enhancement of the overall goal of this project.
