1. The provision of repair/overhaul and other associated maintenance services for Puma HC Mk 2 Undercarriage Components.

2. Services will be provided on a call-off basis and therefore quantities and dates of order and delivery will vary. Estimated throughput will be provided at the tender stage of the process.

3. It is anticipated that the Contract will enable the support of a equipment list consisting of several undercarriage components. Over the term of the Contract, the Authority may have a requirement to add or remove items from the equipment list. If this requirement arises it will be mutually agreed between the Authority and the supplier. The equipment list will be provided at the Pre-Qualification Questionnaire (PQQ) stage of the process.

4. No business whatsoever is guaranteed under any resulting framework agreement or Contract indeed there is no guarantee that any framework or Contract will be put in place in relation to this Notice. No compensation ect will be paid if a tender or resulting framework is withdrawn for any reason. (f) a check carried out by the contracting authority or on its behalf by a competent official body of the member State in which the economic operator is established: (i) on the technical capacity of the economic operator; and (ii) if relevant, on the economic operator's study and research facilities and quality control measures;
