II.2.1. Total quantity or scope

Hobart High School is an coeducational secondary school with academy status, situated in the village of Loddon, near Norwich in Norfolk, England. There are approximately 750 students and 90 members of staff.

The school previously had specialist science college status before converting to academy status in February 2013.

The successful tenderer will be required to provide catering services at the School. The contract covers the scope for the provision of all catering and vending services within the school, which also includes all hospitality and free issue requirements. The contract will also cover provision of meals for the local infant (130 students) and junior (175 students) schools on a dining centre basis.

The successful contractor will be expected to source all fresh produce on a local basis, especially fresh meat, bakery and fruit and vegetables.

The emphasis for this service is on achieving 'best value' and the successful contractor will be expected to demonstrate innovation, flexibility and commercialism.

Additionally, suppliers must provide suitable evidence in the form of the last full year of accounts (audited and accompanied by auditors' confirmation where they are above the statutory threshold for providing audited accounts, or certified by their bank if they are below the statutory audit threshold). Non provision of such evidence to a satisfactory standard will be deemed to be a failure to meet minimum standards of economic and financial standing.

If a business has been recently set up and not audited, annual or endorsed accounts have been produced, unaudited or management accounts for the 3 months prior to the application must be provided and certified by an independent Chartered Accountant or accompanied by a positive bankers reference for the bidder.

Where information is available to the contracting authority that points to concerns over financial viability, further information may be requested to evidence financial viability and non-availability of, or refusal to provide such evidence, will be deemed to be a failure to meet minimum standards of economic and financial standing.
