Uniformed security officers are required to man and operate restricted area access points, main port entry gates and to patrol and monitor the Ports'. Additional duties such as traffic marshalling or Pass Office duties may be required. Harwich International Port requires the contractor to provide staff with detention capabilities to work with the UKBF for the detention and removal of passengers refused entry to the UK and to provide staff to act as customer service assistants in peak periods to work alongside the Port's CSA staff for ferry and cruise operations.

TUPE will apply to both contracts.

At the pre-qualification stage interested parties will be required to demonstrate how they would provide additional manpower within a short timeframe in the event of a change in the security level.
