II.2. Scope of the procurement

II.2.1. Total quantity or scope

Door set 4 — double doors, solid timber panelling internally & externally (American white oak) on solid core blank with solid stiles & rails to be replaced with equal approved door. Allow for additional hinges when rehanging (4 per leaf total). Allow for all seals to leading edges, weathering strip & seal on leading leaf and weather seals to timber frames. Allow for threshold strip with neoprene/EPDM weathering strip.

Door set 5 — double doors, solid timber (American white oak) stiles and rails with glazed panel infill to be replaced with equal approved door. Allow for additional hinges when rehanging (4 per leaf total). Allow for all seals to leading edges, weathering strip & seal on leading leaf and weather seals to timber frames. Allow for threshold strip with neoprene/EPDM weathering strip.

Door set 6 — double doors, solid timber panelling internally & externally (American white oak) on solid core blank with solid stiles & rails to be replaced with equal approved door. Allow for additional hinges when rehanging (4 per leaf total). Allow for all seals to leading edges, weathering strip & seal on leading leaf and weather seals to timber frames. Allow for threshold strip with neoprene/EPDM weathering strip.

All other door sets to be repaired as follows (27 door sets — assume all double doors for pricing purposes with 50 % solid door types & 50 % glazed types):

Remove door leaves and all ironmongery. Clean down & check for damage to external panelling. Replace damaged panelling as required (door sets 10, 11, 12, 13 to canteen — solid panel double doors). Clean leading edges of door leaves and apply new expanded neoprene/EPDM weathering strip at interlocking leaves using 2-part waterproof contact adhesive. Machine new lip from untreated white oak to match existing, and glue & mechanically fix to lock stile to overlap with second leaf. Fit expanded neoprene/EPDM weathering strip to leading edge of lip using 2-part waterproof contact adhesive.

Fit appropriately sized expanded neoprene/EPDM weathering strip to door frames using 2-part

waterproof contact adhesive.

Fit aluminium threshold strip with weather seal at overlap of door and plinth ironmongery — non-fire-escape doors to have flush bolts fitted to trailing leaf and be restrained top and bottom at the leading edge of the leaf. Leading leaf to have new surface-mounted simulated satin steel 3-point panic bolt & push bar with vertical rod at leading edge. Vertical locking shoots to be concealed in a surface-mounted housing fitted to head of door frame & stone floor finish.

Fire escape doors to have new surface-mounted simulated satin steel 3-point panic bolt & push bar with vertical rod at leading edge. Vertical locking shoots to be concealed in a surface-mounted housing fitted to head of door frame & stone floor finish.

All doors to be rehung using minimum 4 hinges per leaf (currently hung on 3 hinges).

Tenders can be submitted by groupings of service providers/suppliers who will not be required to adopt a particular legal form prior to the contract being awarded, but may be required to do so after the award if this formulation is necessary for the good execution of the contract.

However, a grouping of firms must nominate 1 party to be responsible for the receipt and processing of payments for members of the grouping, for managing the service administration, and for coordination. The documents required and listed in the following paragraphs 'Exclusion criteria and supporting documents' and 'Selection criteria' must be supplied by every member of the grouping. Each member of the grouping assumes a joint and several liability towards the European Commission.

III.2. Conditions for participation

III.2.1. Suitability to pursue the professional activity, including requirements relating to enrolment on professional or trade registers

List and brief description of conditions: 1. Candidates' requests to participate must include a solemn declaration, duly signed and dated, stating that they are not in any of the situations

listed hereafter which would disqualify them from participating in a contract. Groupings must furnish a separate declaration for each member.

Candidates shall be excluded from participation in a procurement procedure if:

- (a) they are bankrupt or being wound up, are having their affairs administered by the courts, have entered into an arrangement with creditors, have suspended business activities, are the subject of proceedings concerning those matters, or are in any analogous situation arising from a similar procedure provided for in national legislation or regulations;
- (b) they have been convicted of an offence concerning their professional conduct by a judgment which has the force of 'res judicata';
- (c) they have been guilty of grave professional misconduct proven by any means which the contracting authority can justify including by decisions of the European Investment Bank and international organisations;
- (d) they have not fulfilled obligations relating to the payment of social security contributions or the payment of taxes in accordance with the legal provisions of the country in which they are established or with those of the country of the contracting authority or those of the country where the contract is to be performed;
- (e) they have been the subject of a judgment which has the force of 'res judicata' for fraud, corruption, involvement in a criminal organisation or any other illegal activity detrimental to the Union's financial interests;
- (f) they are currently subject to an administrative penalty for being guilty of misrepresentation in supplying the information required by the contracting authority as a condition of participation in a procurement procedure or failing to supply this information, or having been declared to be in serious breach of its obligations under contracts covered by the Union's budget.

Points (a) to (d) of the first subparagraph shall not apply in the case of purchase of supplies on particularly advantageous terms from either a supplier which is definitively winding up its business activities, or from the receivers or liquidators of a bankruptcy, through an arrangement with creditors, or through a similar procedure under national law.

Candidates must certify that they are not in one of the situations listed above by completing and signing the form in Annex V 'Certification with respect to the exclusion criteria'.

The tenderer to whom the contract is to be awarded must also provide evidence that they are not in any of the situations described in points (a), (b), (d) and (e) above within the time limit stipulated by the contracting authority. This evidence must be in one of the forms described below:

2. Evidence:

- a) the contracting authority shall accept as satisfactory evidence that the candidate or tenderer to whom the contract is to be awarded is not in one of the situations described in point 1(a), (b) or (e) above, a recent extract from the judicial record or, failing that, an equivalent document recently issued by a judicial or administrative authority in the country of origin or provenance showing that those requirements are satisfied. Where the tenderer is a legal person and the national legislation of the country in which the tenderer is established does not allow the provision of such documents for legal persons, the documents should be provided for natural persons, such as the company directors or any person with powers of representation, decision-making or control in relation to the tenderer;
- b) the contracting authority shall accept, as satisfactory evidence that the candidate is not in the situation described in point (d) above, recent certificates or letters issued by the competent authorities of the State concerned. These documents must provide evidence covering all taxes and social security contributions for which the candidate is liable, including for example, VAT, income tax (natural persons only), company tax (legal persons only) and social security contributions. For any of the situations in 1(a), (b), (d) or (e), where any document described in 2(a) or (b) is not issued in the country concerned, it may be replaced by a sworn or, failing

that, a solemn statement made by the interested party before a judicial or administrative authority, a notary or a qualified professional body in his country of origin or provenance;
c) depending on the national legislation of the country in which the candidate is established, the documents referred to above shall relate to legal persons and/or natural persons including, where considered necessary by the contracting authority, company directors or any person with powers of representation, decision-making or control in relation to the candidate.

3. Contracts may not be awarded to candidates who, during the procurement procedure:

(a) are subject to a conflict of interest;

(b) are guilty of misrepresentation in supplying the information required by the contracting authority as a condition of participation in the contract procedure or fail to supply this information;

(c) find themselves in one of the situations of exclusion, referred to in above, for this procurement procedure.

Candidates must certify that they are not in the situation in point (a) by completing and signing the form in Annex V 'Certification with respect to the exclusion criteria'.

(b) delivery (in person or by any party representing the candidate, or by courier) to the address indicated in Section I.1. The department is open from 8:30 until 17:00, Monday to Thursday and 8:30 until 16:00 on Fridays. It is closed at weekends and on European Commission holidays. For deliveries by courier, the valid date of dispatch will be the date on the courier's delivery note. For deliveries made in person or by any party representing the candidate, delivery will, in this case, be confirmed by a receipt dated and signed by an official of the department indicated in Section I.1.

VI.3. Additional information

(1) The attention of interested parties is drawn to the aim of this notice, i.e. to select candidates who will receive the specifications and be invited to tender. The procedure consists of 2 distinct phases. In the first phase, requests to participate sent in response to this notice will be appraised by a selection committee on the basis of the criteria indicated in Section III.2 'Conditions for participation'. In phase 2, all applicants who meet the minimum levels of standards indicated will be shortlisted and subsequently invited to submit a tender. Applicants who are not shortlisted after phase 1 will be informed of the reasons for their elimination from the procedure.

(2) NB: interested parties are requested to strictly observe the conditions stated in point III.2 when submitting their request to participate.

(3) Interested parties are requested to refrain from seeking further information at this stage.

(4) It is likely that a visit to the Grange site will be arranged in order for shortlisted candidates to view the premises. However, no costs incurred by candidates in this regard can be reimbursed by the European Commission. A maximum of 3 representatives from any tenderer may participate in the site visit.

Participation in a site visit is not obligatory.
