The Institute for Health and Consumer Protection/Chemical Assessment and Testing Unit carries out research to improve the understanding of potential health risks posed by chemicals, contaminants released from packaging contact with food materials and consumer products.

In this context we plan to purchase an inductively coupled plasma mass detector to serve the activities on food contact and the activities on characterisation and migration/release from nanomaterials.

Acquisition of an inductively coupled plasma mass detector (ICP-MS) + 24 months' warranty + 36 months' maintenance.

The contract is divided into 2 stages:

stage 1: supply, delivery, installation, testing, on-site training and provision of documentation within 3 months from the signature of the contract + 24 months of warranty, as specified in the tender documents;

stage 2: stage 1 may be followed by a maintenance service of an initial duration of 12 months, renewable up to 2 times, for a period of 12 months, as specified in the tender documents.

The estimated value given below is for stage 1 + 3 years of stage 2.

The organisation of joint offers or offers from groupings is at the discretion of the tenderers, provided this does not infringe the rules of public procurement and fair competition. Such offers will be treated no differently from any other type of offer, each being assessed on its own merits in relation to the evaluation and award criteria contained in the tendering specifications.

Should an economic operator take part directly (sole tenderer or member of a grouping) or indirectly (subcontractor) in more than 1 tender, the contracting authority reserves the right to examine the tender to assess the possible existence of a conflict of interests and/or collusion between tenderers. Should such a conflict and/or collusion be confirmed, the contracting authority reserves the right to exclude the tenderers involved from participating in this procedure.

It is mandatory that joint offers or offers from groupings include a letter of intent from each member of the grouping confirming their participation as described in the submitted bid in the case of award of the contract. This applies also to subcontractors with a budget share of 20 % or more.

Tenders submitted by groupings of service providers will not be required to adopt a particular legal form prior to the contract being awarded. Should they be awarded the contract they may be required to form a consortium or an association or adopt some other form which would allow them to act as a legal entity or provide the lead member with a power of attorney (to be responsible for the receipt and processing of payments for members of the grouping, for managing the service administration, and for coordination and safety). Said lead member must be duly authorised to submit the tender on behalf of the other members of the grouping.

If the contractor is a grouping or consortium of 2 or more persons, all such persons shall be jointly and severally liable to the Commission for the fulfilment of the terms and conditions of the contract.
