The Contracting Authority intends to use an eTendering system in this procurement exercise and reserves the right to use a reverse auction. If and when this requirement is offered to tender, this may be done in whole or in part via electronic means using the Internet. The contract is for the benefit of other participating NHS bodies (whether acting individually, or on behalf of, or together as members of any consortia) along with any other non-NHS bodies which the participants deem necessary for the delivery of services or goods to NHS bodies, local authorities, other government departments or non departmental public bodies charged with the delivery of healthcare or health related services. Products must be packaged and labelled in a way that minimises "look alike" errors. Any collaboration between EMCP, Trusts and Suppliers will be recorded but the details of such discussions will be treated as commercially confidential and would not be disclosed to other parties without the consent of the Supplier. This contract will run from January 2012 for all new product lines (to be finalised at ITT stage).

Precise information on deadline(s) for review procedures: EMPC will incorporate a minimum 10 calendar day standstill period at the point information on the award of contract is communicated to tenderers. This period allows unsuccessful tenderers to seek further debriefing from EMPC before the contract is entered into. Applicants have two working days from the notification of the award decision to request additional debriefing, and that information has to be provided a minimum of three working days before the expiry of the standstill period. Such additional information should be requested via the Bravo eTendering system using the messaging facility within the appropriate ITT. If an appeal regarding the award of a contract has not been successfully resolved the Public Contracts Regulations 2006 (SI 2006 No 5) provide for aggrieved parties who have been harmed or are at risk of harm by a breach of the rules to take action in the High Court (England, Wales and Northern Ireland). Any such action must be brought promptly (generally within 3 months). Where a contract has been entered into the Court may order the setting aside of the award decision or order the authority to amend any document, and may award damages. If the contract has been entered into the Court may only award damages. [The purpose of the standstill period referred to above is to allow parties to apply to the Courts to set aside the award decision before the contract is entered into.].
