1) Short description

This specification is for a state-of-the-art acoustic camera system required as part of the Edinburgh Robotics Alliance (EDU-RAS). The equipment is funded by the Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council (EPSRC) via the “8 Great Technologies” Capital Funding programme.

The required equipment will be used for research in distributed multi-sensor network research in uncontrolled environments for audio signal detection, beam-forming and ultimately tracking and recognition of people interacting with robots and systems.

Failure to provide such a declaration will result in the candidate being declared ineligible and they will not be selected to participate in this procurement process.

(3) All candidates will be required to produce a certificate or declaration demonstrating that they have not been convicted of a criminal offence relating to the conduct of their business or profession.

(4) All candidates will be required to produce a certificate or declaration demonstrating that they have not committed an act of grave misconduct in the course of their business or profession.
