II.2.1. Total quantity or scope

The DDMS must include:

1. An acceptable software package that has the capability to be hosted in both a stand alone and a networked environment to record and manage ionising radiation doses on an individual, task and location basis.
2. The software package will provide the ability to report and analyse doses received by system users to ensure compliance with IRR99.
3. The system shall enable active day to day dose management, but at the time of introduction the system will not be the legal record of dose.
4. The system shall be capable of importing historical records from current and past systems and the approved dosimetry record system, for current users.
5. Active Dosimeters capable of recording exposure to ionising radiation which can be exported in to the software application.
6. Hardware capable of extracting data from Dosimeters and transferring it to the software package. It is anticipated that this hardware will enable self issue of dosimeters to users.
7. IT hardware required to fulfil its function.

The Contractor shall be responsible for:

1. The development of the capability.
2. All aspects of system integration (systems and platform).
3. The supply network.
4. The provision of a capability that will be delivered onto nuclear submarines and dockyards with little or no platform modifications.
5. Overall management of the DDMS.
6. Engagement with the bi-annual DDMS configuration control board.
