The procurement falls outside the scope of application of the directive.

The Council awarded an 8 year contract (commenced in June 2005) with a value of 22 000 000 GBP to the winning bidder identified as a result of a restricted procedure carried out pursuant to OJEU contract notice [2004/S 134-114553](#) of 5.7.2004. That contract notice advertised a 7-year contract with the possibility to extend for a further 3 years. The Council proposes to extend that contract for a further 7 years to expire in June 2020 and also to vary the contract to replace source separation of recyclables with a co-mingled collection service and extend the existing limited garden waste collection service to one that is Borough-wide. The value of the contract over the extended period is set out above. The Council considers that these changes are not material for EU procurement law purposes and that the variation remains within the scope of the original OJEU advertisement and the contract awarded (and therefore no further contract notice in the OJEU is required to be issued) because:

— The Council did not prescribe the method of collection as part of the original procurement specification and the Council is requiring the manner of service delivery to be updated as part continuous improvement in a long-term service contract. Bidders other than those initially admitted were therefore not precluded and the Council is not of the opinion that any additional bidders would have been attracted, or bids priced differently, on the basis of a 7-year extension rather than a 3-year extension,

— The Council does not consider that the scope of the contract is being extended because the collection of household waste and recyclables from the kerbside of individual households was

included within the general scope of the services in the original service specification. Garden waste is a type of household waste,

— Although it bestows revenue income for an additional 5 years to Veolia, the economic balance of the contract is changed in favour of the Council in that the annual cost of the service is reduced immediately from 3 200 000 GBP to 2 700 000 GBP instead of waiting for the outcome of a procurement exercise in June 2013 and service improvements will be secured at almost 9.00 GBP less per household than the initial contract. The extension and savings therefore represents value for money to the Council.
