3. Be available for delivery no later than the 4th April 2013.

Part of the acceptance criteria for any engine chosen will be a full off-wing Performance Test to verify the engine's performance against its logbook and any other documented description. Expressions of interest are requested from potential suppliers who can confirm that any engine offered will meet the minimum requirements listed above.

Please note that failure to provide the requested evidence will render your expression of interest non-compliant.

A compliant expression of interest will trigger an Invitation to Tender to be sent.

There is no deadline by which expressions of interest must be received, however completed Tenders must be returned to the Authority by 10am on Tuesday 8th January 2013. Therefore an early expression of interest is recommended as it will allow potential suppliers more time to complete and submit Tenders.
