Extreme urgency brought about by events unforeseeable for the contracting authority and in accordance with the strict conditions stated in the directive.

The works/goods/services can be provided only by a particular tenderer for reasons that are: technical, connected with the protection of exclusive rights The Protected Mobility Team, part of the UK Ministry of Defence, has amend its current contract with NAVISTAR Defense LLC for the supply and integration of Husky Utility Vehicles to provide for the modification of some of those vehicles already supplied under the contract to carry heavy weapons. It is considered that this amendment to the contract can be placed using the negotiated procedure without prior publication for the following reasons: 1. pursuant to Article 28(1)(d) of Directive 2009/81/EC (Regulation 16(1)(a)(iv) of UK Defence and Security Public Contracts Regulations 2011). This is because due to unforeseen events, the modification of existing Husky vehicles to allow them to carry heavier weapons on operations has become urgent. Tendering this requirement under the open, restricted or negotiated procedures with publication of a contract notice will result in the failure to deliver the equipment to theatre within the required timescale. 2. pursuant to Article 28(3)(a) of Directive 2009/81/EC (Regulation 16(1)(b)(i) of UK Defence and Security Public Contracts Regulations 2011) This is because NAVISTAR Defense LLC are the original equipment manufacturer and a change of supplier will introduce material and different technical characteristics which will result in incompatibility difficulties in operating and maintaining the equipment together with a disproportionate impact on costs and the logistics to ensure maintenance and operations. The Contract will be for a period of less than 3 years. 3. pursuant to Article 28(1)(e) of Directive 2009/81/EC (Regulation 16(1)(a)(ii) of UK Defence and Security Public Contracts Regulations 2011) This is for reasons connected to the exclusive rights belonging to NAVISTAR Defense LLC and such modifications cannot be provided without access to that information. Also for technical reasons as only NAVISTAR Defense LLC has the expertise and is able to produce this modification in the timescale and on the scale required.
