The Police and Crime Commissioner for Nottinghamshire ('the Lead Commissioner') wishes to establish a multi-supplier framework agreement for the Provision of Body Worn Video Devices and Associated Products, Services and Solutions. The primary requirement is for the East Midlands Region of police forces but it is also to be made available for use by the wider UK police force sector. The framework will be established with 5 separate Lots, with the intention of attracting a wide range and varied supply base to meet a range of capability in terms of addressing the spectrum of BWV needs for the East Midlands Region of police forces and the wider UK police force sector.

VI.3. Additional information

The primary location for delivery of these products and associated services will be the East Midlands Region (Derbyshire, Leicestershire, Lincolnshire, Nottinghamshire and Northamptonshire) of police forces initially, but with the scope for the framework agreement to be applicable to the wider UK police force sector. The framework agreement shall be for a period of 4 years and any contracts awarded, by means of direct award or further competition, must be entered into during this period. The value estimated in Section II.1.4 of this Notice represents the estimated maximum aggregate value for all business under all lots for the East Midlands Region and the wider UK police force sector over a period of 4 years for the purchase of Body Worn Devices and Associated Products, Services and Solutions. It is envisaged that the total number of operators present on the framework agreement across the 5 lots will be up to 30. The same supplier maybe present on more than one lot and the lot structure aims to also encourage SMEs to join the framework where appropriate. The framework agreement is not intended to cover physical hardware including storage, but it is intended to deal with devices, software and associated services. The award criteria for selection of tenderers onto the framework agreement and the operating rules applicable to the framework agreement in respect of any further competition taking place or call off by means of direct award, are as set out in the Invitation to Tender documentation. The Lead Commissioner wishes to establish a framework agreement for use by or on behalf of UK police force sector bodies (and their statutory successors and organisations created as a result of re-organisation or organisational change), as listed at the link <http://www.police.uk/forces/> which includes both territorial and non-geographical police forces. The duration of the framework agreement will be the same for all lots, no specific quantity estimates are stated for each lot as part of the framework agreement and matters relating to training, installation and timescales for roll out will be issues specific for each force / region which utilises the framework agreement to agree with their appointed supplier on entering into contract with the supplier. The framework agreement also aims to encourage rebates for volume of orders from all forces utilising the framework agreement. The framework agreement includes the payment of a management fee (of 1 % of all charges placed under the framework) to the Lead Commissioner for the ongoing management of the framework agreement. Forces / regions may also elect to take a modular approach to procuring their BWV needs, by making an award of contract against multiple lots, namely Lots 1 to 3. With regards to duration, there is a further extension option of 12 months available under a Call Off up to a total maximum of 84 months provided such extension does not distort competition. With regards to variant bids, the minimum criteria/requirements are as laid down within the Invitation to tender documentation. The Contracting Authority also requires the Tenderer to provide innovation and continuous improvement and this is reflected within the award criteria incorporated in the Invitation to Tender documentation
