The scheduled school-aged immunisation programmes are based on age-related cohorts. These immunisations for cohort will be carried out within a school calendar year according to the specification.

- Improve on historic immunisation uptake in disadvantaged groups;
- Provide an effective solution for catch up opportunities for the scheduled programmes and all other childhood immunisation programmes (0-19 years), that contributes to increased uptake figures;
- Use IT and technology innovatively to support the provision of information and the ease of response and uptake (e.g. electronic communications with parents, e-consent process, development of apps etc);
