The works, supplies or services can be provided only by a particular economic operator for the following reason:

The P2G PT (on behalf of P2G PT, Sea King PT and Merlin PT), part of the Ministry of Defence, intends to place a contract with Ferranti Technologies Limited (FTL) for the Display Night Vision Goggles support on the Puma, Sea King and Merlin platforms ('the platforms'). It is considered that a contract may be placed using the negotiated procedure without prior publication of a contract notice pursuant to Article 28(1)(e) of Directive 2009/81/EC (regulation 16(1)(a)(ii) of the UK Defence and Security Public Contracts Regulations 2011. This is because FTL is the approved Design Organisation for the existing DNVG used on the platforms and any alternative contractor would have to obtain approvals from the Military Airworthiness Authority and the Release To Service Authority resulting in an unacceptable capability gap. Further, FTL have exclusive access to unique source code required to provide the service required.
