The IAPT programme has established psychological therapy services in each CCG area which are designed to treat common mental issues (depression and anxiety) in accordance with the National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence (NOCE) stepped models of care. Croydon CCG is continuing to expand IAPT provision over 2015/16 and 2016/17 to meet the full National standards by the fourth quarter of 2015/16 and to move to a mixed model of provision, including a counselling service.
