The Commissioner and funding partners have set out in this IFB document their key requirements for the Service and welcome innovative, appropriate proposals from interested parties to enable them to develop a service which best meets the needs of those affected by crime in Cumbria and which is feasible within the context of the current local services, partnership structures and the resources available. Bidders should note that this procurement is being carried out under the Light Touch Regime as detailed in section 7 of the Public Contract Regulations 2015 (the "Regulations"). Whilst elements of this procurement bear similarities to other parts of the Regulations, only section 7 is intended to apply.
