II.2.4. Description of the procurement

RWI — Leibniz Institute for Economic Research (RWI) is a leading center for economic research and evidence-based policy advice in Germany and a member of the Leibniz Association, which connects 93 independent research institutions and includes a wide range of disciplines, e.g. natural sciences, engineering, environmental sciences, economics, spatial and social sciences, as well as humanities.

The Paris agreement aims to keep the global temperature rise this century well below 2°C compared to pre-industrial levels and pursues efforts to limit the temperature rise even further to 1.5°C. To reach these ambitious goals, appropriate policy measures are required. The Kopernikus project Ariadne analyzes which instruments are suitable for this purpose.
