The Contractor will be required to provide a Championship venue in a suitable location that is able to conduct both Alpine and Nordic competitions. The venue must be located on mainland Europe, no more than 1200 km from Calais, no further than 2 hours from an international airport and have good local train and bus links. If weather conditions such as poor visibility, high winds or lack of snow prevent an event from taking place a reserve location is to be provided by the Contractor in time to deliver the event; which must be within 45 minutes driving time from the primary resort.

The Nordic competition must be held on suitable cross country ski courses that meet FIS and International Biathlon Union (IBU) standards with a dedicated biathlon facility that meets IBU standards for safety and competition. On range emergency mountain is to be provided for each race.

A Biathlon Race Office (with telephone communications, broadband internet, desktop computers and printers) is to be provided, central to the Venue and within 800 m of all Hotels used by Championships Officials and Visitors. The Biathlon Race Office shall have an Armoury Room which the Authority will be the sole key holder for the duration of the Exercise.
